Pocket Park Begins

Work has finally begun on creating the Little Acre Fen Pocket Park much to the delight of the Town Council members and officers who have spent many, many hours in getting the project off the ground.

A footpath has been created winding through the park, trees on the site have been staked and the whole area has been cut down and will be sprayed and re-seeded. Temporary bollards to prevent vehicles accessing the site have been installed but will soon be replaced by an 'elephant' gate which will form a permanent barrier.

Once the re-seeding has been completed the Town Council can start the exciting task of deciding where everything should go. The reed beds have been retained in one corner of the site, trees will be planted in the autumn along with a wildflower area and hedging. Benches and nesting boxes will be installed.

One group has already offered to create a bug house and the Council would now like to hear from other groups in the community keen to get involved in the creation of this quiet area where it is hoped people will be able to appreciate the wide Fenland skies and the natural habitat. The site is accessible on foot from the Old Railway Line footpath and West Street (just head for the pumping station).

Over the years the Council has been offered a number of semi-mature trees and if those trees are still available they would love to hear from their owners again so a wooded area can be created.

There will also be the opportunity to plant trees in memory of loved ones.

Ely Shuttle Bus Service

Chatteris Town Council is delighted to announce that working with FACT (the Fenland Association for Community Transport) a new shuttle bus service to Ely will operate on Saturdays from June 9th 2018. The service is being funded by money originally given to FACT by Tescos to run a shuttle bus to their Chatteris store.

Bus journeys will begin in Wimblington with a pick-up in Doddington, two pick up points in Chatteris and will call at Ely Leisure Village and Ely Tescos (to also serve the railway station). Outward journeys will begin in Wimblington at 1.00pm (Chatteris at 1.15pm) and 4.00pm (Chatteris at 4.15pm). Return journeys will leave Ely at 5.15pm and 9.00pm.

For a full timetable and further information please look out for posters or contact the Council on 695166/email chatteriscouncil@btconnect.com .

The cost of the journey will be just £2 return and students aged 14 to 18 will be welcome to travel alone on the bus if their parents/guardians have completed a disclaimer form. Children aged under 14 will only be allowed to travel if they are accompanied by an adult aged 18 and above. Adults are also very welcome to use the service.

All journeys must be booked in advance by ringing **01354 661234** to ensure there are sufficient spaces. Seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. All spaces will have to be booked by 12 noon on the Friday to travel the following day.

The Council hopes this new service will be of great benefit to the local community as it will give easy access to the new cinema and restaurants' area of Ely and the soon to be completed swimming pool and leisure centre. It will also give access to the railway station for those wishing to travel to Cambridge.

Chatteris Neighbourhood Watch, The Way Forward?

Chatteris 'Neighbourhood Watch' (NHW) has been active for many years, working with the police to make Chatteris a safe place, especially for the elderly and the vulnerable.

For those unaware of the work of the NHW, details can be found online at www.cambsnhw.org.uk. In essence a group of residents within a street agree to keep an eye on the properties within the street and surrounding area and also, where possible, the welfare of those in the street. One resident volunteers to act as the co-ordinator and is registered with the police. This person automatically becomes a Chatteris NHW committee member and attends bi-monthly meetings at the KEC to discuss any non-urgent concerns. Urgent concerns are dealt with immediately by telephoning the police on 101 and giving an NHW password to the receptionist.

Once an NHW street scheme is set up, the residents acquire notices to put on lampposts stating the street is an NHW area, warning others they may be watched and reported if they commit a crime. In the course of their day, when at home, the scheme members look out for signs that a neighbour in the street may have a problem, especially if away, and may require help in their absence. Signs such as windows open, newspapers sticking out of letter boxes for more than a day, unusual people visiting or cold calling properties (especially those of the elderly and vulnerable).

History shows that NHW schemes are usually formed after a series of burglaries, or prolonged periods of anti-social behaviour in a street or neighbouring area. These situations were once common in Chatteris and as a result some 40 schemes were formed. Subsequently, the instances of these problems dropped considerably. So much so that today Chatteris has the lowest crime rate in the whole of Fenland. Consequently, perhaps due to complacency, interest in Chatteris NHW has waned in recent years. A recent survey of remaining schemes indicates there are only 14 in operation with co-ordinators.

Recently only a handful of co-ordinators have attended the bi-monthly meetings. Moreover, the current Secretary and the Chairman, whom have served very long terms in office, understandably, now wish to retire. Unless replacements come forward the future of Chatteris NHW is in doubt.

Thus an Extraordinary General Meeting is to be held at the KEC on Wednesday 13 June, at 7pm. All Chatteris residents who are interested in learning about Chatteris NHW, possibly with a view to joining, plus all the members of the current schemes are asked to attend in order to take the Chatteris NHW Association forward in the future.
